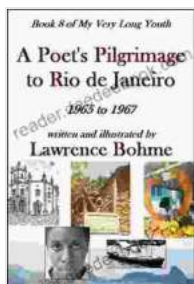


Poet Pilgrimage to Rio de Janeiro: My Very Long Youth

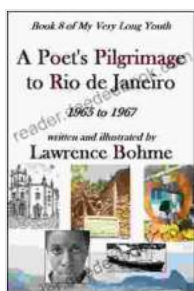

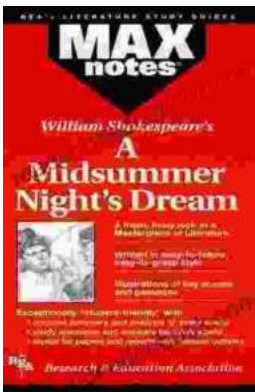
